UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR LEAVE FOR DANIELS COUNTY TO PARTICIPATE AS AMICUS CURIAE

COMES NOW the County of Daniels (hereinafter "County") and respectfully moves this Court for leave to participate in the above-captioned case and appear as amicus curiae. As the Montana Supreme Court has recognized, "the right to be heard as amicus curiae is within the discretion of the court." Eberl v.

Scofield, 244 Mont. 515, 520, 798 P.2d 536, 539 (1990) (internal quotations and citations omitted).

INTEREST OF THE APPLICANT

The County has a strong interest in this case because dozens of County residents are currently students in the Montana University System (hereinafter "MUS") and hundreds more visit MUS campuses each year. The County has further interest in upholding the provisions of HB 102 as County residents are overwhelmingly in favor of HB 102, and County residents have a strong desire to keep themselves and other community members safe on MUS campuses through the responsible possession of self-defense firearms.

REASONS WHY A BRIEF FROM THE COUNTY OF DANIELS IS DESIRABLE

The duly elected 67th Legislature of the State of Montana passed House Bill 102 with the express purpose of "reduc[ing] or remov[ing] provisions of law that limit or prohibit the ability of citizens to defend themselves by restricting with prior restraint the right to keep and bear arms that the people have reserved to themselves in the Montana constitution ..." The County respectfully requests the Court's leave to file an amicus brief explaining why the Board of Regents' (hereinafter "BOR") restrictions concerning the possession and use of firearms on MUS property is subject to prior restraint analysis.

IDENTITY OF PARTY WHOSE POSITION THE COUNTY OF DANIELS SUPPORTS

The County supports the position of AG Knudsen in this matter.
